WEAK OR STRONG?

Is your faith weak or strong? Most of us have moments in which our answer could simply be "Yes!" Faith is not a once-and-for-all thing. Our faith ebbs and flows, along with changes in life circumstances, as we mature and grow in relationship with Christ and with one another. Pope Francis speaks to this in *The Joy of the Gospel*, when he encourages us to be open to an encounter with God's love daily. In these encounters, like the one that the people in the synagogue had with Jesus in today's Gospel, we may be astonished at God's love and are invited to accept it. Weakness in faith is not always the result of some failure on our part. We may simply be at a crossroads, at which we cannot clearly see or understand what comes next. It is at such a time that we step out in blind faith with the assurance that God's love awaits us in every moment.

WEAKNESS AND STRENGTH

The opposite of strong faith may not be weakness, but rather misplacing faith by relying on ourselves, our material possessions, or others. When we think we can do things on our own, we leave little room for God in our lives. When we develop a false sense of security that is rooted in material things, our trust in Jesus is quite shallow. Growing in faith calls us to rely on God's great goodness above all things. When we open our minds and hearts and allow ourselves to be astonished at the love and life found in Jesus Christ, we realize that we do not need to rely on ourselves. Saint Paul teaches us a very important lesson about this in his second letter to the Corinthians, in which we hear, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness."

¿DÉBIL O FUERTE?

¿Tu fe es débil o fuerte? Muchos de nosotros tenemos momentos en los cuales nuestra respuesta podría ser un simple "¡Sí!" La fe no es algo de una vez y para siempre. Nuestra fe refluye y fluye, junto con los cambios en las circunstancias de la vida, al ir madurando y creciendo en nuestra relación con Cristo y con nuestros prójimos. El Papa Francisco habla de esto en *La alegría del Evangelio*, cuando él nos anima a ser abiertos a un encuentro diario con el amor de Dios. En estos encuentros, como el que tuvieron las personas en la sinagoga con Jesús en el Evangelio de hoy, podemos asombrarnos del amor de Dios y estamos invitados a aceptarlo. La debilidad en la fe no siempre es el resultado de algún fracaso de nuestra parte. Quizá simplemente estamos en una encrucijada, en la que no podemos ver claramente o entender lo que sigue. Es un tiempo que salimos con una fe ciega con la seguridad que el amor de Dios nos espera en cada momento.

DEBILIDAD Y FORTALEZA

Lo opuesto a una fe fuerte quizá no es la debilidad, sino al contrario, poner la fe en nosotros mismos, nuestras posesiones materiales o los demás. Cuando pensamos que podemos hacer cosas por nuestra cuenta, dejamos poco espacio para Dios en nuestras vidas. Cuando desarrollamos un sentido falso de seguridad que está enraizado en las cosas materiales, nuestra confianza en Jesús es bastante superficial. Crecer en la fe nos llama a confiar en la abundante bondad de Dios sobre todas las cosas. Cuando abrimos nuestras mentes y corazones y nos dejamos asombrar por el amor y vida que se encuentran en Jesucristo, nos damos cuenta que no necesitamos confiar en nosotros mismos. San Pablo nos enseña una lección muy importante acerca de esto en su segunda carta a los corintios, de la cual escuchamos: "mi gracia te es suficiente, la fuerza se hace perfecta en la debilidad".

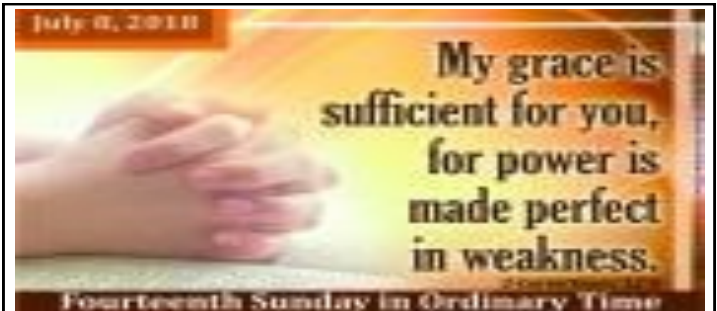
I wish all of you students, teachers and parishioners a very restful summer. Please do not take a vacation from God. If you happen to travel outside of San Antonio, or even outside of Texas or the United States of America, please remember to attend Mass on Sunday or everyday if possible. God blesses us with life, health, families, friends, great country, and we need to be grateful every single day. Let us worship Him as much as we can. I would also like to remind you that if you do not attend Mass at St. John Berchmans during the summer time, please remember to either mail us your weekly monetary contribution or drop off your envelopes or monetary contribution in the Parish office. We need to continue to support our parish even during the summer. The parish's bills need to be paid even during vacation time. Thank you for your collaboration and generosity. May God guide you and protect you during the summer time.

The tickets for our annual Fall Festival raffle are now available. We have 10 wonderful prizes with \$5,000 being the first prize. I invite each family to sell at least 100 tickets for \$1.00 per ticket. We have ordered 50,000 tickets and I have personally taken 1,000 tickets. My expectation is that everyone sell as many tickets as possible. Remember the profit from our annual Festival will help us pay bills and eventually purchase an electronic marquee. I have trust and confidence in each one of you to rise to the occasion.

I thank all of you who have pledged or donated money toward the Capital Campaign. St. John Berchmans community is required to raise \$352,000 with \$140,800 the equivalency being 40% being returned to our parish to address three projects that we have identified for our community. As of the weekend of June 16 - 17, 2018, only 31.2% have pledged or paid. Please consider making your pledge as soon as possible. I thank those of you who have contributed toward the campaign.

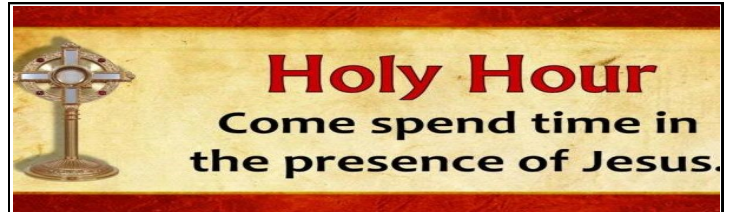

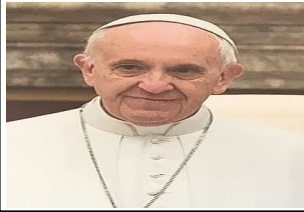

OBSTACLES

The prophet Ezekiel, Saint Paul, and the Lord Jesus share something in common in today's scripture readings. They all experience obstacles to their ministry. Ezekiel is summoned to prophesy to the Israelites, who are "[h]ard of face and obstinate of heart" (Ezekiel 2:4). Saint Paul recounts how he has been given a "thorn in the flesh" (2 Corinthians 12:7). The Lord Jesus is unable to perform many signs in his native place. The Gospel tells us that "[he] was amazed at their lack of faith" (Mark 6:6). We too sometimes encounter obstacles as we travel along the journey of faith. So often we experience weakness on this journey and yet the strength of God is made manifest.
