SHOW NO PARTIALITY

Not only do we at times show little care for the earth and its beauty, but we resist the command of God to care for each other in our need. James warns us not to give pride of place to those who are rich and obviously so. He points out the needy, those poorly dressed, and warns us to care for them and not to look down on them, for God sees their need and also their trust in God and love for others. It is such as these whom Jesus came to heal and give hope.

Similarly, in the reading from Isaiah, God's coming is accompanied by the opening of the ears of the deaf and the eyes of the blind. God comes to make the lame leap and the mute sing. (So, everybody, please sing in church. It gives glory to God!)

BE OPENED

Jesus came to give hope to the little ones, those who could not fulfill the laws of the Pharisees to keep kosher with separate jugs, kettles, and so on, because they were too poor to afford two of everything. They could not afford doctors or the healing practices of the time. But Jesus gave them hope.

A person who was lame and mute would have had no way to be made "normal" in those days. But Jesus has mercy on those in need, and he cured the deaf and mute man and restored him to his community.

In what way are we lacking in faith or in hope that we will be healed by Christ? We often forget how much God loves us and how close God is to us every day. If we could just remember this, we would not be afraid, would not feel inadequate in our dealings with the world, nor would we lack courage in protecting our world from destruction.

God loves us beyond any love we could comprehend, and stands ready to heal all our wounds and to bless us with the gifts of secure faith, firm hope, and love for each other in Christ.

No solo a veces mostramos poco cuidado por el planeta y su belleza, sino que nos resistimos al mandamiento de Dios de cuidarnos unos a otros en nuestras necesidades. Santiago nos advierte que no debemos dar el lugar de honor a quienes parecen y son ricos. Él señala a los necesitados, a los andrajosos, y nos advierte que debemos cuidar de ellos y que no los despreciemos, pues Dios ve sus necesidades y su confianza en Dios y amor por sus prójimos. Es por ellos por quien Jesús vino a sanar y darles esperanza.

De manera similar, en la lectura de Isaías, la venida de Dios está acompañada por la apertura de los oídos de los sordos y los ojos a los ciegos. Dios viene para hacer que el cojo salte y el mudo cante. (Entonces, todos, por favor canten en la iglesia. ¡Esto da gloria a Dios!)

Jesús vino para dar esperanza a los más pequeños, aquellos que no podrían cumplir las leyes de los fariseos como mantener comida Kosher guardada en recipientes separados, etc., porque eran pobres y no podían tener cosas dobles. Ellos no podían pagar doctores o remedios de aquellos tiempos. Pero Jesús les dio esperanza.

Una persona que estaba coja o muda no tenía forma de hacerse "normal" en aquellos días. Pero Jesús tiene misericordia de aquellas personas necesitadas, y él sanó al sordo y al mudo y los restauró a su comunidad.

¿De qué manera nos falta la fe o esperanza de que seremos sanados por Cristo? A menudo olvidamos lo mucho que Dios nos ama y que tan cerca está Dios de nosotros cada día? Si tan solo pudiéramos recordar esto, no tendríamos miedo, no nos sentiríamos inadecuados en nuestros tratos con el mundo, ni nos faltaría el valor para proteger nuestro mundo de la destrucción.

Dios nos ama más allá de cualquier amor que pudiéramos comprender, y está listo para sanar todas nuestras heridos y bendecirnos con los dones de una fe segura, esperanza firme y amor por cada uno en Cristo.



SEE BEYOND OUTWARD APPEARANCES

The phrase "Sunday best" has lost much of its meaning in our society today. Some lament the loss of people dressing up for church on Sunday; others think it's a healthy sign that we're as casual in attire gathered before the Lord as we are elsewhere. No matter which school of thought on this topic we belong to, James would probably chastise us. In either case, we are still focused on external appearance, mistaking it for some sort of favored position before God. True, James criticizes the community that favors the rich and well-dressed while ostracizing the poorly clothed, but even more he criticizes the making of distinctions, making choices based on criteria that having nothing to do with the reign of God. James might turn our attention to the reign of God described by Isaiah, in which people are healed and the earth becomes ripe to bear fruit. Jesus today is focused on this reign of God, healing a Gentile man in a region hostile to his Jewish faith, not mindful of the man's origins or clothing or status or ability to repay. Isaiah, James, and Jesus in Mark's Gospel, all call us to look more deeply to find where the will of God needs to be done, and has been done, on earth as in heaven.

How have I failed to be open to those who were outside my present community? How can I welcome those who are outsiders?
